The present Yarwell & Nassington Band was formed more than 20 years ago. Its roots go back in to the early nineteenth-century and claim to be one of the oldest bands in the country. Our history books show that certain families have been involved in the band for a long while. We are still fortunate to have some members of these playing with us today.

During the year the band plays at many events, both local and further afield. In 2003, we took part in the twinning celebrations in St André de la Marche. This was a first trip for many, and a great opportunity to meet our French friends and share our musical talents with them.

For several years we have taken part in the Whit Friday Marches in the Saddleworth area just outside Manchester. This annual festival draws over 100 bands from across the UK and other countries and is a wonderful opportunity to play to large audiences and to hear local youth and top-class bands.

An annual highlight is our regular Last Night of the Proms concert at our 'home ground', Nassington Church. For many years this concert has been done for Spinal Research and more recently for Help for Heroes. This recording features a few numbers from the recent concert, themed 'Music from the Movies'. Some of these provided an opportunity for some dramatic forays by various members of the Band, which have become a feature of these concerts.

Just recently we have welcomed an influx of young players and they were specifically featured looking fearless and scary, with swords and pirate outfits for our rendition of Pirates of the Caribbean, which is played on this disc. This CD is our first venture into the world of recording, and the project has been great fun and good experience for the Band.
